About the Show Covers

This year's show covers celebrate USS Nevada (BB-36) "The Ship that wouldn't Sink"

July 29th Cover: Despite being hit by a torpedo early in the Japanese attack that started around 0800 on 7 December 1941, Nevada was moving by 0840, the only battleship to get underway that day. Nevada was hit by no less than 6 bombs and 1 torpedo that day. July 30th Cover: Nevada was repaired and upgraded after the Pearl Harbor attack and continued to play an important role during the war in both the Atlantic and Pacific. After the war, deemed too old, the Navy assigned Nevada as primary target for atomic bomb testing conducted in 1946. Nevada survived tests "Able" and "Baker," however, was extremely radioactive. Seventy-five years ago, on 31 July 1948, Nevada was towed 65 miles out of Pearl Harbor for gunnery practice. Again, the ship did not sink. Nevada was, finally, unceremoniously sunk by an aerial torpedo that hit amidships.

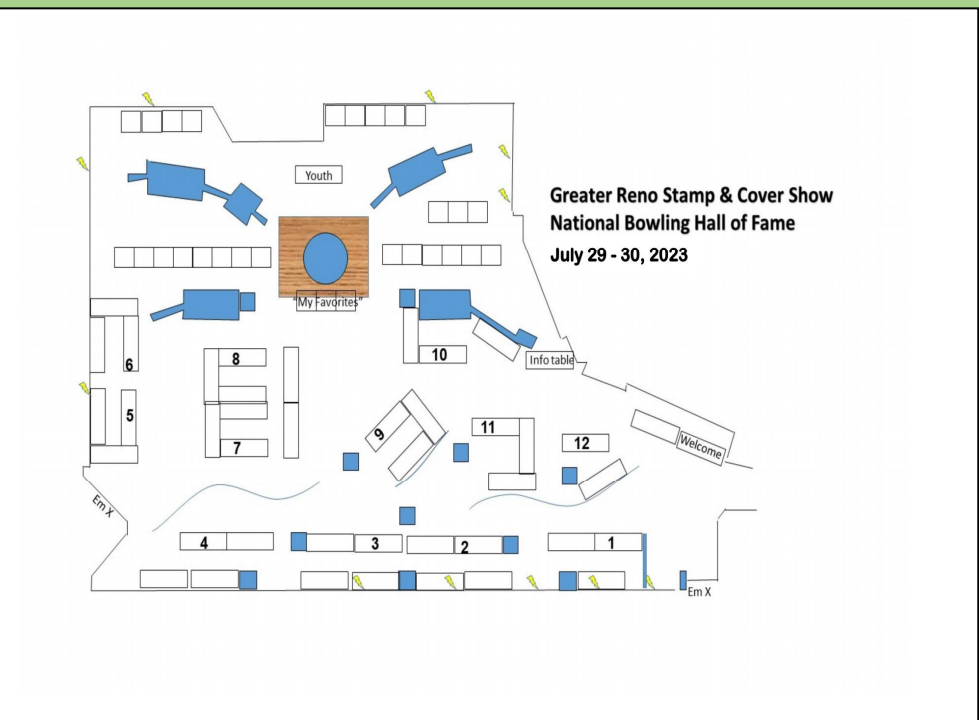
